## AT MASS AND IN YOUR PRAYERS THIS WEEK

Please remember with the whole Church, our Pope Francis and those who hold high office under him.

**Our whole Diocese follows a cycle of Prayer**, so during Ordinary Time (Autumn) we are asked to pray for: the Spread of the Gospel; the Harvest, the Fruits of Human Work, and the Reverent use of creation; Students and Teachers; Justice and Peace in the World; All Victims of War; Young People; Prisoners and their Families.

**In our own Parish**, we pray for all parishioners and visitors; for those who are unable to be with us today, the sick and the housebound and those who care for them, and all who have asked for our prayers, all those who have died recently and all those whose anniversaries occur at this time. May they rest in peace.

## THE ENGLISH MARTYRS: Saint Ambrose Barlow

His life was one of such exemplary holiness that, even if it had not been graced with martyrdom, he might still have been a candidate for canonisation. He was of the family of Barlow Hall, Manchester, and at Didsbury nearby there used to be a small font in which he is believed to have been baptised. In spite of his high birth, he was, like Edmund Arrowsmith, unimposing in appearance, his dress being primitive.

His missionary work was mainly in the districts of Leigh, Ormskirk, Warrington and Winwick. He had the opportunity of leaving Lancashire and would probably have preserved his life had he done so. But a strange incident in his life had convinced him that it was his lot to suffer for his faith in the country, and he could not be prevailed upon to leave it. In 1682 he was able to be of service by ministering to Fr. Arrowsmith, then in captivity in Lancaster gaol. On the night of Arrowsmith's execution that martyr seemingly appeared to Barlow in southern Lancashire and told him that he would be next to suffer at Lancaster, then three other priests after him, and after these no more. In the morning Mr Barlow told the family what had happened to him in the night, but suspected it was an illusion as Friday was the usual execution day. But on hearing that Arrowsmith had been executed the day before, a Thursday, Mr Barlow was convinced of the truth of what he had seen and heard. Barlow's execution in 1641 was indeed the next martyrdom to follow at Lancaster, and his head and quarters were impaled upon the Collegiate Church at Manchester and on the walls of Lancaster Castle. A triple execution took place in Lancaster in 1646, and then no more. Three other prests were later condemned at Lancaster, but they were never executed.
